

KAPA Research & Specification and KRMCA Technical & Quality Control

The KAPA Research & Specification and KRMCA Technical & Quality Control Committees met August 6, 2014 in Topeka. The meeting was jam packed with a number of items on the agenda.

First up, committees heard a presentation from Dr. Matt O'Reilly from the University of Kansas' Department of Civil, Environment & Architectural Engineering on their ongoing research of concrete durability. Dr. O'Reilly presented laboratory tests, field work, and the effects that curing has on concrete durability. A good group discussion and Q&A followed the presentation.

Next, the committee was updated on the new Pre Qualified Materials List (PQL) and Part V Specification changes. The PQL list can be found online at http://ksdot1.ksdot.org/burmatrres/pql/default.asp. Part V is in the process of being merged online. Currently only the whole book is available, but a Part V link will be available soon. Standard Submittal forms were also discussed. They get updated regularly on KDOT's website. You must access them with a login and password. You will also be able to access them through our Members Only section of the www.kapa-krmca.org website as soon as that part is ready to be released.

Some other issues the committees discussed were air void analyzer and petrographic analysis testing and some timing issues between contractors and producers when it comes to approval and mix designs. The producer needs about a 90 day window for approvals & mix designs and the contractor needs to allow a fair amount of time for the preparation. A good discussion stemmed around testing and timing.

Durability and curing continued on as a discussion throughout the meeting. The committee has decided to update some brochures that producers and the Association use for promotion, *Guidelines For Durable Exterior Concrete* and *A Contractor's Guide for Quality and Durable Residential Flatwork*. The brochures will be updated and new ones printed soon.

The committee meeting wrapped with some discussion on curing concrete and the need to educate the industry about it. An announcement was also made to put the ACI Contractor Day on the calendar for April 15, 2015.

The next meeting of the KAPA R&S and KRMCA TQC Committees will be held in November with details announced soon. As always all members are welcome to attend any of the Associations committee meetings.

House Bill will Stop EPA from Expanding Federal Regulation of Water and Wet Areas Vote Expected Next Tuesday – <u>Send a Letter Today!</u>

Next Tuesday, the House is expected to vote on <u>H.R. 5078</u>, the Waters of the United States Regulatory Overreach Protection Act. This bill would halt the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (Corps) <u>proposed rulemaking</u> that redefines "waters of the U.S." under the Clean Water Act (CWA). The legislation will prevent the agencies from going forward with a vast expansion of regulatory authority that is inconsistent with Supreme Court decisions and, in many times redundant with state regulatory authority.

The bill also requires the agencies to rewrite the rules in consultation with state and local governments to form recommendations for a consensus regulatory proposal. <u>Tell your Representative</u> to vote in support of this important legislation.



he "Touch a Truck" event's organizers ordered more last year, and they still were running low with more than two hours to go.

used for public safety, construction and other purposes from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday near downtown Topeka. To get the T-shirts, they had to get signatures on a "passport" from the operators of 20 trucks to prove they had visited a variety of vehicles, said Edie Smith, director of marketing had at last year's event. and membership for Downtown Topeka Inc.

Last year, they had only 150 shirts, and ran out within an hour, Smith said. This year, they had about 600 shirts and started running low by noon, despite the fact that the kids had to collect 20 signatures this year, up from 15 last year. Several people offered to buy the shirts, but the point is to teach kids about construction and public safety, she said.

"Every year we try to get bigger and better," she said.

Zach Snethen, one of the organizers of the event, estimated between 3,000 and 4,000 people attended. They gave out 2,000 "passports" to children and gave out all 600 T-shirts, he said.

"We were very pleased with the response of participants and attendees and plan to take the event into its third year next year over Labor Day weekend," he said.

Organizers moved the event to the 700 and 800 blocks of S.E. Quincy this year to avoid construction on S.

Kansas Avenue downtown. More than 30 large vehicles used than four times as many T-shirts this year as they had for construction or public safety lined the street Saturday morning, and a sand pile provided by Kansas Sand & Concrete, Inc. attracted kids who used toy versions of some The event allowed children to climb into large vehicles of the big equipment to set up their own construction sites — or bury each other.

> New elements included a children's activity area, where the Kansas Children's Discovery Center and other groups had set up activities like building towers with wooden blocks, coloring and balloon animals. Stands selling HHB BBQ and Italian ice also were new this year.

> As usual, the main attractions were the trucks. Many of the bigger trucks drew lines, with a Topeka fire engine attracting



plenty of attention. Another apparent favorite was the Harvesters' tractor-trailer, where children and their parents could take a brief ride on the platform used to lift heavy items into the truck.

Nikki Babcock said she brought her son Roman, 5, and daughter Alyssa, 4, because they love construction equipment and enjoyed the event last year.

"They get excited when they see diggers and cranes," she
